Meeting Minutes

October 18, 2016
Austin Gem and Mineral Society Building

Erich gaveled the meeting to order, noting the good turnout tonight. He reminded everyone of the upcoming AGMS show Friday and that we will discuss this after the break. Paul then introduced tonight's speaker, Anna Weiss, whose topic is "Crustose Coralline Algae Increased Framework and Diversity on Ancient Coral Reefs", a presentation written by Ms. Weiss and Rowan Martindale, under the Department of Geological Sciences, UT Austin. Weiss began by noting that modern reefs are being damaged and proposed that science may gain insight into the causes of it by studying ancient reefs in the fossil record. She described CCA as red algae that encrust and reinforce reefs, contributing to the reefs' stability and diverse habitats. In addition to being an integral part of modern reefs, these scientists have confirmed evidence of the presence of CCA in fossil reefs. Weiss outlined characteristics of thriving reefs and credited the activity of this type of algae as a major positive health factor for them. Their research conclusion shows a similar positive correlation of this red algae and fossil reefs, and suggests a possible avenue toward strategies that promote the recovery of damaged modern reefs. She then took various questions on symbiosis, keystone species and reef decline. We then took the break and Erich urged us to return for discussion of pending issues.

After the break, we were reminded to sign in on tonight's attendance sheet and to sign up to volunteer at Gem Capers and Fossil Fest. Mike assured us that no great expertise is required to be involved in these events. Erich prodded us to just be enthusiastic and sign up to be a part of the upcoming shows. Mike reported that our booth at Pioneer Days went well, with lots of interesting things to see there. Ed gave a brief report on the field trip to Lake Texoma and beyond. Erich then brought up Fossil Fest and the upcoming election of our club's officers and Board. He noted that Suzanne will be stepping down from her position as Show Chair these past 4 years and that Emelia Rose may fill this post, using her skills as a project manager. Noting that Dale will be leaving the Board Secretary position, Erich called for someone to fill that vacancy, which is creating a written record of each meeting and submitting it for use in the monthly newsletter. Erich announced that Mike will be staying on as Treasurer, and that Paul will continue as Program Chair, and that he himself will continue as President. He asked Ed what his status is as Field Chair. Ed stated he would stay another year if no one steps up to fill that position. Then Dr. Sprinkle requested a correction to the wording of the meeting minutes related to his presentation last month. Erich brought up the need to order new t-shirts, which come in 4 different colors and that will be discounted for show volunteers. Then Bill gave the latest details on the publication of his new echinoid book, due out in early November. Suzanne and Erich described this year's Fossil Fest theme, "Ancient Sharks", and told about the show's Grand Prize, a large Megalodon Tooth. They requested that we lend fossil shark items from our own collections for the Fossil Fest display cases. Suzanne said that if you order a t-shirt now, you may pick it up at the November meeting. She repeated the request for us to sign up to volunteer at Gem Capers and Fossil Fest. Erich gave parking details for Gem Capers and noted that our November meeting is the Tuesday before Fossil Fest and expressed hope to have a full slate of candidates to announce at that time. Erich gave final encouragement to us to step up and fill a position, explaining that even Show Chair has its duties clearly spelled out. Ed said of the vacancies: 'Just take it.', meaning that you won't be in competition for the position from another person. The door prizes were won by Angie and Mary, Kathleen, Suzanne, Lee and Christine. Then the meeting was adjourned at 8:30.
